THE HOSPITAL FOR SICK CHILDREN

The following abbreviated timeline through 108 years of history was prepared from the minutes of the Alumnae Association Executive Meetings and Annual General Meeting Minutes. You will notice that although much was being done by Alumnae members, this is not necessarily reflected in this timeline. Stories of the Alumnae and their involvement in world events can be found in the articles written for the <u>Alumnae News</u>, the newsletter of the Association since 1937. Some of these articles can be found on the website and copies of the newsletter are available in the Archives at SickKids.

Since the Association's inception in 1903, dramatic changes have taken place in the World- wars fought, diseases conquered, new technologies developed so that progress was possible on all fronts. Health care itself has evolved to the point that our practices today might well be unrecognizable to our early graduates.

In the early years, Alumnae meetings brought friends together socially and through lectures and presentations by medical staff provided what we now call post-basic or continuing education for nurses. Eventually this function was assumed by other associations and colleges. However, far-sighted graduates from the beginning clearly recognized the need for continuing education for nurses. They established ongoing support in the form of scholarships and bursaries. The Florence J Potts Scholarship in particular was given regularly from 1922 onward. This is mentioned specifically here as it was decided to create a separate link to F.J. Potts recipients rather than include their names in this timeline.

1903 - 1905 **First President – Jennie Smedley, Class of 1892** (Go to the About Us /Our Alumnae Association section for a link to a list of Alumnae Presidents)

1903

- The Alumnae Association of the Training School of The Hospital for Sick Children (HSC) was formed and held its first meeting on November 13, 1903. Meetings were held on the second Saturday of each month.
- Alumnae heard "instructive addresses" from medical staff and discussed articles of interest to nurses.

1904

Having a central registry of nurses was seen as a priority and Ella Sheppard (1895) was appointed the first representative of HSC to meet with representatives of other schools. The Central Registry became an assured fact.

- The Sick Benefit Association was formed to assist members of the Alumnae if they became sick or had an accident.
- 1906 **President Josephine Hamilton, Class of 1888** (first graduate, Hospital for Sick Children, School of Nursing)
 - A cookbook entitled Invalid Cookery was published to raise funds for Sick Benefit Fund.

1907 President – Grace Gowans, Class of 1902

1908 President – Maude Barnard, Class of 1898

- Josephine Hamilton, Class of 88, was the first representative sent to the National Association of Trained Nurses convention in Ottawa.
- > The Graduate Nurses' Club was formed

1909 President – Lina (Rogers) Struthers, Class of 1894

The Graduate Nurses' Club changed its name to The Heather Club. Members worked for the prevention of tuberculosis among children and to provide milk and other necessities for needy families by making layettes and other pieces of handwork.

1912

Responsibility of The Heather Club was assumed by a chapter of the Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire (IODE). Josephine Hamilton (1888) was the first President of the chapter.

1913-15 President – Leta Teeter, Class of 1906

- First membership dues of \$10 were paid to join the National Association of Trained Nurses (later became the Canadian Nurses Association) to send delegates to the annual convention.
- First membership dues of \$10 were paid to join the Ontario Graduate Nurses Association (later became the Registered Nurses Association of Ontario)

1916 -18 President – Ella Jamieson, Class of 1896

- > The Constitution and Bylaws were first adopted by the Alumnae Association
- 1919-20 President Alice Grindlay, Class of 1914
- 1921-22 President Marion (Starr) Storey, Class of 1917

The Florence J. Potts Scholarship (\$350) was instituted in 1922 in honour of Florence Potts, an outstanding Hospital Superintendent, nursing administrator and teacher at HSC from 1913 – 1922. She successfully guided the Hospital and the School of Nursing through changing and challenging times. The scholarship was given annually to a graduate nurse for continuing education.

(NOTE: Over the years, the sum was increased. In 1984, this scholarship became a bursary and was awarded to an RN with at least one year nursing experience for fulltime study in the field of healthcare, at a college or university. Although preference was given to HSC graduates, the bursary was also offered to members of the hospital nursing staff. > Annual Dinner held in the Royal York Hotel.

1931

- Annual Dinner held at the Royal York on June 30, 1932
- > The Constitution and Bylaws were revised at a General Meeting April 11.
- > Annual Dinner held in Eaton's Round Room on June 6

1933 President – Nora Moore, Class of 1911

School of Nursing calendar stated of the Alumnae Association: "Its object is to keep the graduates in friendly touch with each other and their Alma Mater and further, to maintain the very highest standard of professional nursing."

1934 President - Marion (Starr) Langford, Class of 1917

1935 President - Jean (Millar) Strachan, Class of 1920

1936 President – Jean (Griffin) Russell, Class of 1924

1937-38 President - Jean Masten, Class of 1930

1937

- The Alumnae News made its debut as the result of the energy and inspiration of a committee of four: Marion (Starr) Langford (1917), Helen (Drummond) James (1916), Hazel Hughes (1922), and Jean Masten (1930).
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(Note: Despite early trials and tribulations, The Alumnae News became an important way for members to stay connected, learn about marriages, births, deaths and travels, achievements in nursing and at the hospital. Articles gave a unique perspective on nursing at HSC, progress in the field of medicine, reflections on world events that had a profound impact on the graduates of the hospital. 1938

> 15 Christmas baskets, each containing a complete Christmas dinner, were distributed.

1939 President – Marguerite Waddell, Class of 1919

- Women's Auxiliary of HSC grew out of the efforts of the Alumnae Association. Members met on the first Monday of each month and sewed layettes for the infants

 - > 350 graduates live in the Toronto area. However, only 149 are paid members of the Alumnae Association

- 1945 46 President Muriel (Tilson) Clifford, Class of 1938

 - > The Constitution and Bylaws were revised Sept 26, 1950.

1951 President – Nora (Boult) Welch, Class of 1939

When the new hospital opened at 555 University Ave, many members of the public wanted to visit. Alumnae volunteers, recruited to act as tour guides, conducted 75 tours.

1952 President – Betty (Forbes) Land, Class of 1946

1953 President – Joan (Pope) Wensley, Class of 1948

1954 – 56 President – Helen (Howe) Junkin, Class of 1926

- 1954
 - The Hospital asked the Alumnae for help in conveying children with cancer to and from Toronto General Hospital for radiation therapy. Members of the Alumnae formed the Conveyance Committee and assumed responsibility for accompanying the children and orderlies to TGH.
 - A special Alumnae award was introduced to be given to a student nurse in her graduating year who was outstanding in her nursing practice and her involvement in the school itself. The first nurse to receive the award was Marilyn (Scruton) Medlock (1954).

1956

- The special Alumnae award was divided into two \$25 prizes to be offered in the intermediate year: one for General Proficiency and the other for Highest Standing in Practice of Nursing.
- A special and memorable event was added to the graduation festivities when the Alumnae Association began to host the *Mother and Daughter Tea* the day before graduation.
- Two of the stained glass windows were donated in honour of four pioneer nurses responsible for establishing the School of Nursing: Hannah J. Cody, Sarah Annie Kinder, Louise C. Brent and Florence J. Potts.
- > Alumnae Scholarship awarded to Lorna Donaghy (1955)
- > Alumnae prizes to Lynn Anderson and June Barber (1954)
- By this time there were 1700 graduates from the School of Nursing and the Alumnae Association was actively looking for new members to join.

1957 – 58 President – Katherine (Lea) McLean, Class of 1936

1957

Two bursaries were created as a result of two bequests from former graduates. The Association received \$3,000 from the estates of Anne (Blair) Shuttleworth, (1897). The full amount was invested and the interest was used to assist student nurses. The Alumnae Executive provided \$150 per annum to two graduating nurses. The *Anne Blair Shuttleworth Bursary* was presented each year at graduation until 1974.

1958

> Alumnae Association now had 564 members.

> Grandmothers Fund initiated

- Alumnae Association sponsored a cultural programme for student nurses. This was organized through the Student Council with guidance and support from the Alumnae and Women's Auxiliary.

- The objectives of the Alumnae Association remained the promotion of unity and good fellowship among the graduates of the school; the advancement of the interests of the School of Nursing and the professional and educational advance of nursing.

1960 – 61 President – Veronica (Shantz) Philips, Class of 1953

1960

- (Students started going to Bancroft Outpost Hospital)
- (Opening of new nurses residence 180 Elizabeth Street- Nov 17)

- A stained glass window was dedicated to Jean Masten (1930). Its inscription read "To the Glory of God and in Tribute to Jean I Masten, Director of Nurses 1939 – 61. Given by Alumnae Association, School of Nursing "
- 75th Anniversary of School of Nursing held on September 28 & 29 gala celebration – held in the Crystal Ballroom – King Edward Hotel. Phyllis Norton (1938F) presented a skit entitled "1886 and All That" – 541 guests attended.
- > 50th Anniversary Luncheon and Garden Party held at Thistletown.

- General Proficiency Renee Thomson (1962)
- Highest Standing Deanne Colley (1962)
- The Association now had 652 paid members. Annual membership of \$2.00 was due each October. If payment lapsed, your name was removed from the membership list after two years. A life membership cost \$25.00

1962 President – Gladys (Fletcher) Martyn, Class of 1951

- Florence J. Potts Scholarship for post graduate nursing continuing education became fully endowed. Please see link under About Us/Our Alumnae Association for Potts Scholarship winners through the years.
- (School of Nursing now required successful completion of Grade 13 with a 60% average in order to enter the school)

1963 – 64 President - June (Ferron) McGreal, Class of 1956

1963

- > The Constitution and Bylaws were revised on January 15, 1963
- A second stained glass window was presented by the Alumnae in honour of Jean I Masten (1930) who had retired as Director of Nurses in 1961, having held the position since 1939. This window is in the chapel on the second floor of the Atrium.
- In September a new service to the hospital began. Thirty-five members volunteered to spend at least 2 hours each month in direct patient care. Marilyn King (1956F) led the group as they provided routine bathing and feeding and accompanied patients to various departments. They wore 'cheery' yellow uniforms with their hospital caps and pins.
- > For the first time Graduation was held in the Fall instead of the Spring.
- > Alumnae prizes went to Susanne Newman and Nancy Atkinson (1964)
- HSC Alumnae Chapter was organized in Vancouver by Lillian (Calberry) Chalmers (1948) and Jenny (Hover) Rush (1950)

1964

Alumnae provided special awards to recognize Alumnae members who had made

outstanding contributions to the Association, to nursing and to the hospital. A pin incorporating the letters HSC in a diamond–shaped setting was presented to: Matilda Fitzgerald 1914), Mabel St. John (1920), Alice Boxill (1923), Marjorie Russell (1923), Mary (Shuttleworth) Raymond (1924), Helen (Howe) Junkin (1926), Vyvienne (Smith) Code-Smith (1950), and Veronica (Shantz) Phillips (1953)

- > Ottawa Chapter organized by Carol (Henderson) Gibson (1957)
- Halifax Chapter started by Carolyn (Cormack) MacDonald (1960)
- London Chapter started by Eileen (McKee) Murray (1956)
- > General Proficiency Pamela Daniel (1965)
- Highest Standing Nancy Ostrander (1965)
- (Opening of new Gerrard Street Wing)

1965 – 66 President – Marjorie Russell, Class of 1923

1965

- General Proficiency Anne Debus (1966)
- Highest Standing Lynda Fallis (1966)
- > \$1280 was pledged to hospital campaign
- Donation was made to Hospital Health Services Department for taxis and to be used at the discretion of the staff.
- St Lucia Project St. Jude's Hospital, Vieux Fort, St Lucia, British West Indies. Members gathered new and used equipment, surgical supplies, diapers, towels, wash cloths, etc to help establish and equip a paediatric ward on an old hospital base used by US Services during the war.

- Second shipment of supplies sent to St. Jude's Hospital, including wash basins, emesis basins, urinals, bed pans, and used nursing textbooks.
- (Miss Geiger appointed Assistant Director of the Hospital as well as Director of Nursing and Education. This was the second time a dual role was taken on by a nurse. Kathleen Panton (1910) was an Assistant Superintendent of the hospital as well a Superintendent of nurses between 1921 and 1928.)
- > **General Proficiency -** Eleanor Brackenridge (1967)
- Highest Standing Judith Cole (1967)
- > Toronto West started a chapter at Thorncrest Village Club.

1967 – 68 President – Joan Mansell, Class of 1953

1967

- Alumnae Centennial project was to increase capital in the Scholarship Fund to have \$1,000 available for awards each year
- > AGM held Jan 31 in Elizabeth McMaster House with 17 members present
- > General Proficiency Rose Brubacher (1968)
- > Highest Standing Georgia Angelotti (1968)

1968

- A gift of \$1,000 was given by members to the nursing film library in memory of Mary Hally (1896)
- The graduation dance was sponsored for the first time. It was held at the Royal Canadian Yacht Club. Silver spoons were presented to each graduate.
- > General Proficiency Candice Metcalfe (1969)
- Highest Standing Patricia Goetz (1969)

1969 – 70 President – Nancy (Nash) Hall, Class of 1953

1969

- > General Proficiency Patricia MacPhee (1970)

1970

 (Internship year started for 3rd year students (2 + 1). Students were paid \$325 per month and had to provide their own accommodations.)

1971 – 72 President – Ruth (Duncan) McCamus, Class of 1959

1972

- History of the School of Nursing was written by Hilda Rolstin (1943) for the Alumnae Association. It was dedicated to the graduates of the School of Nursing.
- > AGM held Oct. 3

1973 – 74 President – Margaret (Gourlay) Spahn, Class of 1948S

- 1973
 - > The Constitution and Bylaws were revised on May 29

1974

(NOTE: The last class of student nurses graduated from the Hospital for Sick Children School of Nursing. Training and education for nurses was moved to the community colleges and universities by government mandate. HSC nursing program was moved

to Ryerson University.)

- > AGM held at Elizabeth McMaster House with 32 members present.
- Total membership: 695
- > Florence Potts Scholarship was awarded for the last time.
- Ann Blair Shuttleworth Bursary and Florence Potts Scholarship funds moved to the Hospital to be used by the Nursing Education Department. Preference for both awards was to be given to HSC graduates and then to any nurse who worked at the hospital and would be returning.
- The future of the Alumnae was a serious concern due to an apparent lack of interest and limited capital funds.
- Ann Blair Shuttleworth bursary awarded to 2nd year Ryerson student Catherine Messenger
- Money sent to St. Lucia to buy Christmas toys.

1975 – 76 President – Thelma May, Class of 1945

1975

- > AGM held in February with 41 members present.
- > Total membership 682 out of 2617 graduates.
- Nurses graduating from Ryerson in Class of 1975 were invited to become HSC School of Nursing Alumnae members
- Constitution and Bylaws revised
- Jean I Masten Fund moved to the Hospital for administration
- Retiring presidents received alumnae pins
- > A second general meeting was held on October 21 with 31 members present:

1976

- Keys goals of the Alumnae Association: maintain source of funding, increase memberships, groom members for Executive positions.
- > \$33,000 transferred to the Hospital for administration.
- (At this time the Women's Auxiliary managed the archives).
- > Some discussions on having a museum.

1977 – 80 President – Elizabeth Morrow, Class of 1952

- > Spring Tea held in May with Executive members providing the food.
- AGM held October 18 speaker was Mrs. Betty Youson "Genetic Counselling: The Role of the Nurse"
- ➤ (Hilda Walsh, RN retired.)
- First year that the Hospital hosted the 50th Anniversary luncheon for the Class of 1927.

1978

- > The Constitution and Bylaws were revised at the AGM on January 24.
- 75th Anniversary of the Alumnae Association was celebrated on May 12 with nearly 600 graduates in attendance.
- The first Jean I Masten Lecture was held at the same celebration. Guest lecturer was Honorable Margaret Birch, the Provincial Secretary for Social Development. A silver spoon from Birks with HSC logo given in thanks.
- > Alumnae fiscal year changed to end of September
- Fifty dollars sent to St. Lucia for Christmas gifts

1979

- > (John Ross Memorial stained glass window was moved to the newly renovated library.)
- > (Family Information Centre opened with Ruth McCamus (1959) in charge)
- > AGM held October 30 annual dues were \$3.00

1981 – 83 **President – Anne (Herbert) Brown, Class of 1973**

- A gift of \$200 to the Family Information Centre, \$200 to Spina Bifida and Hydrocephalus Association of Ontario and \$200 to the Canadian Foundation for the Study of Infant Death.
- Alumnae Bursary Fund and Benevolent Funds set up
- Jean I Masten Lecture held May 14 Dr. Shirley Stinson was the speaker. 200 attended.
- AGM held October 26 in Elizabeth McMaster House with 30 members present. Total membership: 824
- Christmas luncheon held on November 18

- > 3 bursaries of \$1500 each were awarded
- Constitution changes fees for Annual membership \$3.00 per year and a Life membership for \$35.00
- (Plans were underway to tear down the Elizabeth McMaster nursing residence in order to make way for the new hospital on Elizabeth Street.)
- > AGM held at Elizabeth McMaster House on October 25 with 23 members present

1984 – 86 President – Carolyn (Weir) Hitchinson, Class of 1970

1984

- The Constitution and Bylaws were revised on October 23, 1984 at the Annual General Meeting held at the Elmwood Club.
- A legacy in excess of \$35,000 came from the estate of Audrey Backus. This bequest was used to create the Audrey Backus Bursary for Part-Time Studies. Miss Backus was a long time resident of Toronto and left one-third of her estate to the Alumnae Association. This bursary was given to a graduate who had been a member of the Alumnae for two years and who was pursuing a degree in the field of healthcare.
- > AGM held at Elmwood Club with 32 members present. Total 925
- > Audrey Backus Bursary Diane Vosburgh (1969) and Marilyn Booth (1970).
- The Florence J. Potts scholarship for continuing education became the Florence J. Potts Bursary. It was awarded to an RN with at least one-year nursing experience for full-time study in the field of healthcare at a college or university. Preference was given to HSC graduate but was awarded to HSC nurses as well. This bursary was administered by the Hospital.

- > AGM held at the Elmwood Club October 22.
- > Alumnae Bursaries to Donalda Parkes (1960) and Elizabeth Huggan-Smith (1969)
- > Christmas Luncheon moved to the Delta Chelsea.
- > Audrey Backus Bursary Barbara Sherk (1968)
- Two research projects (\$2,000 each) were given to Rebecca Frank "The Effect of Music on Children receiving Chemo" and to Eleanor Pask (1959) for "The Impact on a Family with an Infant on an Apnea Monitor"
- Life Membership fee changed from \$35 to \$60. Annual fee changed from \$3.00 to \$6.00.

1986 – 87 President – Elizabeth (Breen) Walker, Class of 1974

1986

- 100th Anniversary of the School of Nursing was held October 25 at the Hilton Harbour Castle – 806 graduates attended.
- > Christmas Luncheon held November 16 at the Delta Chelsea.
- > Members of the Alumnae pledged \$100,000 to the HSC Capital Campaign.

1987

- (Elizabeth McMaster House torn down in preparation for the construction of the new hospital. Bricks were sold to help raise funds)
- AGM was held on October 27 at the University Women's Club with 23 members present. Total membership: 982
- > Three Alumnae bursaries awarded.

1988 – 89 President – Beverly (McRae) McMurchy, Class of 1960

1988

- > Jean I Masten Lecture was held on June 4 Speaker Dean Dr. Alice Baumgart
- AGM held December at the Westbury Hotel with 50 members present. For the first time, the Annual General Meeting and the Christmas Luncheon were combined.
- Membership fee increased to \$75 for a Life Membership and \$10 for Annual Membership. Total membership: Life members 873: Annual 62
- Hospital held the 50th Anniversary luncheon for the Class of 1938
- Task force set up for long term planning ultimate goal to turn funds over to the Hospital

1989

- > AGM December 2 at the Westbury Hotel 62 members present.
- Five Alumnae bursaries awarded
- Hospital held 50th Anniversary luncheon for Class of 1939

1990 - 91 President - Nancy (Leek) Peters, Class of 1964

- Jean I Masten Lecture was held on May 12 Helen Thomas (1964) Speaker "Nurses Role and the Impact of Health Care in Canada"
- > AGM and Luncheon held December 1 at the Westin Hotel 113 members present.

- The Benevolent Fund changed its name to "Connections" to better reflect the nature of the outreach and scope of the activities enabling 'connection' with members who might benefit. Three key Executive members who carried the responsibility of caring for and connecting with the members were: Jeanette Gillespie, 1935S, Barbara Fleming, 1952 and Betty (Caufield) Martin, 1960
- > Hospital held the **50th Anniversary luncheon** for the Class 1940 in October

- > AGM and Luncheon held on Nov 23 at the Delta Chelsea with 112 members present.
- > Hospital held **50th Anniversary lunch** for Class of 1941
- (The nursing archives, managed by the Women's Auxiliary, were incorporated into the Hospital)
- ➤ \$4,000 in bursaries awarded.

1992 – 95 President – Heather (Newburn) Tuckey, Class of 1962

1992

- The membership raised \$109,000 in support of the Hospital's Capital Campaign for the new hospital on Elizabeth St. A special plaque recognizing this gift is placed on the Wall of Donors in the Atrium. (Note: The Hospital for Sick Children is now officially also known as SickKids – a name affectionately used for the hospital for most of its existence)
- Jean I Masten Lecture held in May with Speaker Ellie Pask "Ethical Issues in Health Care: Changing Essence of Nursing" – 60 graduates attended.
- Bursary recipients : Susan Bell RN (1973) and Paula Milo RN
- The Alumnae News had been published and sent to members once or twice a year from 1937 onward. In 1992 a Newsletter Committee was formed, consisting of an editor, coordinator and one other member. Ellie Pask (1959) became editor.

1992

- > AGM and Luncheon was held on November 28 at the Delta Chelsea with 110 present.
- ➢ Hospital hosted 50th Anniversary lunch for Class of 49 − 12 graduates attended.
- Membership database was created with 768 Life Members a representative from each class was identified.

1993

AGM and Luncheon held on November 28 at the Delta Chelsea with 55 members at the AGM and 110 present at the luncheon.

- A trophy was presented to the class with the most members present at the Annual General Meeting and Christmas Luncheon. The first year winner was the Class of 1949.
- > Bursaries awarded to: Christine Foster RN (1973) and Sheila Rowe RN (1964).

- The Constitution and Bylaws were revised at the Annual General Meeting on November 26, 1994.
- > HSC grad pins were appraised at \$300.
- Class of 1968 donated \$500 to bursary fund.
- Bursaries awarded to Mary Lyn McMaster RN, Dorothy Forbes RN (1970), Colleen Kearney RN (1970) and Sheila Rowe RN (1964)
- AGM and Luncheon held at the Delta Chelsea with 66 members present for the AGM and 95 for lunch.
- Graduates of the Class of 1975, who began their training at HSC and graduated from Ryerson University, were welcomed as members.

1995

- Jean I Masten Lecture held May 6 Speaker Denise Avard, Executive Director, Canadian Institute Child Health.
